## **COVID19 PUI – BREAST MILK HANDLING AND TRANSPORTATION**

Checklist to be used for collection and transport of breast milk of patients that are being ruled out or have confirmed COVID19, when the patient's newborn is in NICU. **MAIN POINTS:** 

## 1. Patients may breastfeed and provide expressed breast milk to NICU babies.

2. Patients are instructed in hand-washing, mask and gloves. No need to wash breasts.

## 3. Milk containers are wiped cleaned and transported by staff to NICU.
