OBRC CORNER Hello & Welcome!



CHICKASAW NATION MEDICAL CENTER BECOMES OKLAHOMA'S 7TH BABY-FRIENDLY HOSPITAL

A huge congratulations to Chickasaw Nation Medical Center who just received their Baby-Friendly Hospital designation in May!

Oklahoma now has 7 designated hospitals which means 15.3% of Oklahoma babies are born in a hospital that provides the optimal level of maternal/newborn care as determined by an official outside assessment.

EDUCATION SPOTLIGHT

Recently, there has been a lot of coverage, both on social media and elsewhere, regarding neonatal hypernatremia due to infrequent feedings and dehydration. Our sympathies go out to those immediately impacted in these stories.

This media attention helps intensify the value of the role of the skilled lactation care provider as well as the healthcare team in providing appropriate support for breastfeeding maternal-child dyads.

OBRC's role is to help support educational needs for *all* healthcare providers, from nurses to physicians, so appropriate and adequate care for every breastfeeding dyad can be obtained. As we all know, no two breastfeeding couplets are the same, and the well-being of both mother and child need to be addressed to help sustain the breastfeeding relationship as well as the general health and welfare of each.

In the stream of this media attention, frequently breastfeeding is seen as the cause of this negative situation whether appropriate or not. For those of you dealing with any backlash, please see the list of resources for medically-based responses to these types of situations.

Also, this is a good time to recommend more education for hospital staff on the topic of breastfeeding and how to appropriately assess mother and child. See page 6 for a listing of upcoming classes held by OBRC that can help in acquiring more knowledge.


National Breastfeeding Month is coming!!!





BREASTFEEDING UPDATES New Drug Recommendations for Children & Breastfeeding Mothers

The Food and Drug Adminstration is restricting the use of codeine and tramadol medicines in children and is also recommending against their use in breastfeeding mothers due to possible harm to their infants. As a result, several changes are being made to the labels of all prescription medicines containing these drugs, including the addition of a strengthened warning to mothers that breastfeeding is not recommended when taking codeine or tramadol medicines due to the risk of serious adverse reactions in breastfed infants. These can include excess sleepiness, difficulty breastfeeding, or serious breathing problems that could result in death

Ulcerative Colitis/Crohn's Disease & Breastfeeding?

A clinical research study is looking for women age 18+ who are taking vedolizumab for ulcerative colitis OR Crohn's Disease, and are currently breastfeeding a child. The purpose of this study is to test the concentration of vedolizumab in the milk of breastfeeding women. You do NOT need to live close to a physician or study site to participate in this trial. Study visits will be performed by a visiting home nurse. Health insurance and doctor referrals aren't needed to participate.
