

Can you believe it- ten years?!? Ten years the Oklahoma Breastfeeding Hotline (OBH) has existed. I know, I know; we here at OBRC can hardly believe it either.

Though much has changed in the past ten years, much has stayed the same as well. And one of the most consistent things has been our never-wavering breastfeeding support by International Board Certified Lactation Consultants through the Oklahoma Breastfeeding Hotline.

The hotline got its start as a brain child of Becky Mannel and the Oklahoma State Department of Health. What first began at OU Medical Center as a warm line for mothers needing breastfeeding help after hospital discharge quickly exploded in volume with calls from across the state. With volume so high, the need was evident, and OBH was born.

One of the major goals of OBH was to provide skilled IBCLC care to breastfeeding parents, regardless of location or income. We at OBRC are happy to say we have met that need. In these first 10 years, OBH IBCLCs have helped over 19,000 breastfeeding families and taken over 25,000 calls.

We at OBRC are proud to manage OBH, with help from our partner organization Oklahoma State Department of Health as part of their Preparing for a Lifetime initiative. We wouldn't be who we are without our great partnerships!

As a way to celebrate and give back, OBRC will have two events to honor not only the legacy of OBH, but also the employees that make up our wonderful team. As y'all know, an organization is only as good as it team members, and we're pretty lucky to have some of the best IBCLCs in the nation (in our humble opinion).



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BREASTFEEDING UPDATES

ACOG Committee Opinion: Optimizing Postpartum Care

ACOG's recent publication on optimizing postpartum care emphasizes the importance of this critical period for the lifelong health of both mother and child. ACOG recommends all women should be seen within 3 weeks of giving birth by an obstetric provider. They also stress the importance of lactation support and including IBCLCs or other lactation support providers on the health care team to enable women to meet their breastfeeding goals. Finally, ACOG endorses the need for paid parental leave as essential for "all women to recover from giving birth and nurture their infants."

Currently, the US Dept of Health and Human Services is allowing for public comment on Healthy People 2030. Right now the proposed objectives for Healthy People 2030 only has ONE breastfeeding objective. This is a HUGE decline from Healthy People 2020, which included EIGHT breastfeeding objectives (one of which had four sub-objectives).

To ensure momentum and support of breastfeeding, please comment. Note commenting is NOT lobbying. Submissions are due by Jan 17.
